



In 2017, Arkansas' Little Rock School District chose to work with ODP Business Solutions™ Workspace Interiors to furnish a new, state-of-the-art high school for the city's growing community. Little Rock Southwest Magnet was the first high school to be built from the ground up in over 50 years.

After not building a new high school since 1968, the school district planned to combine the student bodies of two high schools at the new Little Rock Southwest Magnet High School. Administrators recognized the size of the undertaking and the extent of the coordination that would be required to furnish the 400,000-square-foot facility in time for back-to-school.

Since the project was so much bigger than previous ones, district staff knew that the way they had managed furnishing new facilities in the past wouldn't work for Southwest. With extensive experience in the education field, the team members at Workspace Interiors knew they could design and deliver a learning environment that would be worthy of the capital city's flagship high school.

The district needed its vendors and staff to work together to give students their new high school on time, especially through 2020's unexpected challenges.

The new high school would be an advanced learning environment in 400,000 square feet of academic and athletic space. Home to 65 classrooms, it would host nearly 2,000 students. The district's timeline was specific and fixed: The high school would open in August 2020.

Work began in 2017 and the project was on track in early 2020, when everyone unexpectedly shifted to working from home. Communication on a project of this size would be tough under any circumstances. But without access to the site, it became even more critical. The Workspace Interiors team bridged the gaps by using their experience and communication skills from the project's start to its finish.

Previously, the district's purchasing team managed furniture for the middle school. The \$4.4 million Little Rock Southwest Magnet High School project was much bigger, so the district chose Workspace Interiors to coordinate the furniture from order entry through delivery and installation.

With everyone working remotely for the last six months before school began, communication was key as the Workspace Interiors team drove the project toward the finish line. A dedicated Workspace Interiors project manager kept administrators updated as the team:

- Worked with the architect to specify and select the high school's furniture
- Checked for the proper standards, specifications, and finishes
- Managed the furniture purchase and installation
- Coordinated communication among stakeholders and vendors
- Provided project management and general coordination

The Workspace Interiors team forged a solid relationship with the architect and used a phased approach — as each section of the school finished construction, the team managed the furniture installation. This process boosted efficiency, but it also required them to be more careful in ordering, monitoring, and managing the timeline to avoid incurring additional costs.

The team coordinated an agreement between the district and its supplier, enabling Workspace Interiors to act as the district's agent. The arrangement saved money and eased the burden on the district staff, who didn't have to coordinate multiple vendors and processes.
